<b>SUBJECT:</b> Regulation of Gasoline Pricing
<b>DATE:</b> September 12, 2001
<b>New Administrative Order</b>

The Codified Ordinances of the City of Dublin grants the City Manager, acting in his role of Emergency Management Director, the power to declare an emergency period. Such emergency declaration was made on September 11, 2001 at approximately 10:15 a.m.

During an emergency declaration, the Emergency Management Director is also empowered by Section 36.05(B)(2) to promulgate such regulations, as he/she deems necessary to preserve critical resources and/or to preserve public peace, health and safety. Under the Authority of this section at 7:00 p.m. on September 11, 2001 the following regulation was established:

All gasoline sales within the City of Dublin, Ohio shall be conducted in a fair, equitable and responsible manner with full consideration given to crowd control, traffic flow and public safety. In no case, until further notice, shall the per gallon price of any grade of gasoline exceed the average per gallon price of the same grade of gasoline by greater than 10%, as compared to all other gasoline providers within the City of Dublin. The maximum price, until further notice, shall not exceed \$2.50 per gallon.

Conviction of violation of this regulation shall be punished as a misdemeanor of the third degree under Authority of Chapter 36.99 of the Dublin Codified Ordinances.
